An artistic character is like a model in which people's complex relationships are studied. The writer examines his protagonist, leaving him freedom of movement. In each play, the writer uses a series of psychological techniques that allow him to penetrate the inner world of the protagonist in order not to "limit" his protagonists to anything.

Psychology includes the moral principles, aspirations, frustrations, character, attitude to life, complexes, abilities, level of intelligence, personality traits (introvert, extrovert) of the protagonists of the work.

2. Discussion and the results.

The image Rastinyak in O. Balzac's "Father Gorio" of and Raskolnikov in Dostoevsky's Crime and Punishment was also used for comparison.

The the character of students in world literature, its psychological features have been described differently by many writers. Their moral principles, character traits differ from each other. For example, in the book "Under the western eyes" by Evelyn Vaugh, the student protagonist Razumov is portrayed as a sad person. "Razumov doesn't seem to talk much, even when he's deeply affected." One of his personal characteristics is his dislike of women. "What do I have to do with women. I don't care what you think of him. Let them do whatever they want. I'm not interested in them at all. As Razumov charcter Raskolnikov, the protagonist of F. Dostoevsky's "Crime and Punishment", has a character that he does not like human beings. "He was lost in thought, he was deep in thought, he didn't want to see anyone, not just the housewife, he was afraid of meeting someone face to face. "[2]

Rastinyak, the protagonist of Honore de Balzac's "Father Goriot", is completely different from these two heroes. Both his character and attitude to life are completely different. He liked to walk among more people, nobles, to walk with ladies. "Realizing the importance of the role of women in society, he made a plan to join the aristocracy in order to find a sponsor. Eloquent young man and chattiness, particularly on these qualities, so it tends to be the woman figure and that would be added to his beauty""[4]



This student preferred to choose an easy life for himself. He prefers to live a light life through others rather than through his own labor.

At the same time, one can meet the knowledgeable, intelligent and wise students who live the life of the heroes in the image of the student. Evelyn Waugh's "Decline and fall" "Paul Pennyfezer, for a time, voted with due diligence and caution in elections, evaluated ballet and literary criticism more carefully than others, was intelligent, polite, and fluent in a foreign language." He was one of the most determined young men." [9]

Also, the protagonist of Tom Wolf's "I am Charlotte Simons" Charlotte is portrayed as a well-educated, intelligent, polite girl who went to university on her own. "But I think this time there is an exception to the rule. Really, I can't turn a blind eye to that. Thus, this girl, who received a maximum of sixteen hundred points and five in the four profile tests of her choice, was privileged to receive a presidential scholarship throughout North Carolina." [1] The girl, who was fortunate enough to be a student, could not hide her astonishment. She was very pleased to come to Dupont University. But the culture and character of the students there was not very different from what she expected. "Hooliganism, rudeness, shamelessness, actually half-naked walking - appear in front of strangers on the same towel ... and drink ... two hours after assistant-tutor Mrs. Ashley warned all freshmen not to have alcohol in the dormitory, the students drank."[1] To a student who said she would only take knowledge, the situation seemed very strange. Even university professors saw this as a normal situation, and higher education was not what she expected. Student psychology was a lifelong pursuit rather than a completely different education.

We can find a similar situation in the work of another writer. The protagonists of Donna Tart's "The secret history" amaze the reader with the psychology of students and their behavior. The story is told by one of its participants, Richard Paypen. A nineteen-year-old boy who had come from California in those days to study ancient Greek. He miraculously managed to join Julian Morrow's student group of five rich and uneducated young men who were passionate about ancient Greece. For Richard, who is not so rich, new friends open up a completely different, attractive world. In this play we can meet different students as they walk.
