Being polite is about controlling your behavior. Such control allows a person to avoid bad behavior. If a person cares about the morality of his behavior, he is socializing. Discipline is based on the results obtained in the psychology of youth, which is seen as a process of studying socialization. Traditions and customs play an important role in raising the effectiveness of child rearing. Folk

customs, traditions and rituals have a great educational value. They bring people together and develop a sense of friendship and brotherhood. These, in turn, serve as role models for young people.

Honest work for the happiness of an independent society, the constant care of everyone to preserve and increase the wealth of society, a good understanding of social duty, honesty and integrity in public life and personal life, morality honesty, humanity and humility, never allowing national and racial hatred, etc. are important qualities of the educational process.

Caring is an important part of parenting. Children are more likely to imitate a caring parent than an indifferent parent. When caring parents do not support the child's negative behavior, the child will sooner realize the consequences of their actions. In the process of upbringing, along with care, it is necessary to follow a discipline based on love. It involves explaining and discussing constant communication with the child, verbally reprimanding the child if the child's behavior requires it, and rewarding the child for good behavior.

The technology of the educational process can be interpreted as follows:

- 1. The pupil should be understood as an individual, not a repetitive one. It is necessary to determine the structure of its needs.
- 2. Positive behavioral habits through positive emotions should be formed. Both consciousness and will are a hierarchy of motives cannot form. After all, one need is replaced by another can only occupy the need.
- 3. The child with the means to meet these needs arming and communication from the educator, as well as empathy nor does it expect to be armed with exactly these tools. As Aristotle put it, "Education requires three things: talent, to science, practice »
